PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

We welcomed Marty Ogle, the Catholic Education Tasmania 'Making Jesus Real' Education Officer. I share his letter that he forwarded to us after his visit last week. I hope Marty's insights and messages offer you food for thought and hopefully a confirmation that our school values, 'values' in words and deeds. Dear Parents/Carers,

I had the honour of recently teaching children from Year 6 at St Patrick's and we focused on:

1. The word EMPATHY - how it is important to try to understand others by walking in their shoes. We talked about how difficult it is for parents, step-parents, grand-parents, teachers, homeless people etc. We discussed how we need to constantly reflect on how we judge or treat people.

2.The 'Spirit of Jesus' - following the teachings of Jesus by sharing, helping, caring, speaking positively etc. We were able to pinpoint many examples of this in and out of the classroom. I left a huge 'The Spirit of Jesus is all around us 'board to keep reminding us all to look for and copy great Spirit of Jesus moments.

3. Being a **W.E.S.T. person** - **W**elcoming, **E**ncouraging, able to say **S**orry & **T**hank You. We also spoke about the need to put a name to these four aspects of GTS (Greet, Treat and Speak) so as to make it personal.

4. We again spoke about how much they love their people at home and how they love being happy. But sometimes we make a bad choice, which in turn becomes a bad habit by back chatting or saying no or 'Why me?' at home when asked to do a chore. Students wrote 'OK' with a smile on their hand to remind them to say this at home and at school.

5.The power of **focussed listening** - we spoke about a number of areas that will help better listening

including: thinking about who we sit next to; not fiddling; asking questions; being 'present' in the conversation; listening with your eyes; practicing and recognising good listening; staying clear of gossip; ignoring 'disturbers' when the teacher is speaking etc; listening to all instructions before starting. We also discussed that teachers waste SO MUCH time waiting for everybody to listen eg 30mins - an hour a day!!!! The reaction of the students was so positive that I wanted to share with you how well they listened and how it could benefit your family, so please ask them about the above topics.

Finally, I want to say how privileged I was to be at St Patrick's and continually see the 'Spirit of Jesus' moments from the staff and students - you should be proud that your child attends such a great school. It has been a challenging year in so many ways but the staff and students continue to 'brush off' the interruptions and difficulties - way to go! Keep encouraging them to have a positive attitude even when life gets tough.

I am sure that if you ask your child about 'What did they know about MJR' you will have a super conversation with your child and discover that with encouragement they will hopefully develop these positive habits. We also have a new podcast - 'The MJR Podcast - a GPS for life'. A person can be compassionate anywhere.








eSafety-Tips on how to stay safe online (Mrs Badcock)

Progress Achievement Testing - Term 4 Week 3 (Mr Atkins)

Progress Achievement Tests (PAT) are formal tests that students in Years 1 - 6 complete annually. These tests are one way that we can track student progress from year to year. All students in Years 1 - 6 complete the PAT Reading and PAT Maths tests, students in Years 2 - 6 complete the AGAT test (general reasoning ability) and students in Years 3 - 6 complete the PAT Spelling and PAT Vocabulary tests. These tests are timetabled to occur during Week 3 of term 4.

Care and Concern



2020 Pre-Kinder; 2021 Kinder

St Patrick's School will be offering a Pre-Kinder program each Monday morning for five weeks for children who have been accepted into our 2020 Kindergarten class. The sessions will begin at 9.00am and conclude at 10.30am, and all sessions will take place in the St Patrick's School Kindergarten classroom on the following days (children to bring a drink & morning tea): Monday 16th November; Monday 23rd November; Monday 30th November; Monday 7th December; Monday 14th December. This timetabling will mean the usual 'Inquiring Minds - Setup for Success' sessions that we offer on Fridays will still be offered as usual.

The five Pre-Kinder sessions are aimed to provide children with a realistic 'taste' of kindergarten for 2021; it is expected parents leave their children with the kindergarten staff for the duration of the program – coffee, tea and a light morning tea will be available to parents for all sessions. The parent sessions will be convened in the school assembly hall, beginning at 9.15am, concluding with a catered morning tea at 10.15am. More information will be communicated early in term 4.
