#### **PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION**

The great American educator, John Dewey stated that, "Education is a social process. Education is growth. Education is, not a preparation for life; education is life itself." I don't believe Dewey was inferring schools and teachers as being intrinsically important people as we are only too human and self-critical for that; I believe, instead, that he was referring to education being an acute reflection of our willingness and ability to learn from the lessons that life presents. Our greatest regrets usually lie in wasted opportunities and Advent certainly encourages us to seek some respite from busy lives and focus on what is important and good in our lives, and to allow life's lessons to lead us, and others, to renewal.

Last Sunday we entered the Advent season, traditionally a time of preparation, and a cursory review of current news reminds us of the importance to learn from the experiences of others in order to hopefully prepare for 'our day.' However, regardless of our preparations and anticipations, life will undoubtedly involve us, our family, friends and colleagues, with a lesson in which we are almost always ill-prepared. Advent implies waiting, patience, preparedness - qualities that challenge all of us in this most busy of ages of humankind. Pope Francis is quoted as saying, "Christmas is more than a temporal celebration or the memory of a beautiful event; Christmas is an encounter." So, as we enter the final few weeks of the 2020 school year, I pray that we all have the opportunity to reflect on John Dewey's statement regarding education and accept the notion that, whilst there are many unknowns that we are not able to prepare for or prevent in our lives, we can still prepare ourselves for what life presents to us by seeking opportunities to learn from each and every experience - I feel we can always gain much from each and every encounter with each other in our school community, for which I am deeply grateful.

Year 3: Tanner Davis for his great application to designing and creating a pencil case in our box repurposing challenge.



On Saturday 14 November our two First Lego League Teams from St Patrick's took part in the Hobart Regional Tournament. The students took the judges through all the hard work that they had put into developing their Innovation Project, their Robot Design and Coding. They also had to continually display the First Lego League Core Values of Teamwork, Cooperition (Cooperation and Competition) and Gracious Professionalism. Both teams did extremely well in the judging section, with one of the teams winning one of the minor trophies, the 'rising all star award'.

Both teams managed to score well in the Robot Game also. The Robot Game is where the teams have 2.5 minutes to show how many of the missions their robot can complete successfully. All the hard work that goes into building and coding the robot comes down to three 2.5 minute sessions, however the judges only count the best score from the three attempts. Both teams from St Patrick's managed to place in the midfield with scores of 165 points (equal 10th place) and 155 (12th place). All of the students enjoyed seeing how other teams went about building and programming their robots to complete the missions and everyone learned a lot and had fun on the day.

# **2021 Stationery Packs**


- 2021 class stationery packs are now available for sale to parents from the school office.
- •Parents have been provided with a stationery list for their child's respective 2021 class parents may choose to purchase items through their preferred supplier **OR** they may choose to purchase the stationery pack from school.
- •Class stationery packs will be sold as a unit we will not be breaking-up the stationery packs that we have ordered and paid for as intermediaries between retailer and families in order to supply the odd item for families.
- Parents are requested to refrain from purchasing outside the set class stationery list in the interests of avoiding unneeded distractions in class, please do not purchase items such as sequinned pencil cases or outlandish stationery items that will distract children and which usually causes unneeded anxiety if the item gets lost or broken.

Other information to note regarding the 2021 stationery packs include:

- Please ensure your child's stationery items are **clearly labelled with your child's name** unnamed items get lost very quickly and are often not reclaimed and school staff may need to ask for extra items to replace lost items sooner than expected.
- We prefer all stationery pack list items are **brought to school at the beginning of the school year** school staff will carefully store each child's pack and also label your child's specific books early in 2021 with the respective subject e.g. Mathematics, Writing; Journal; Science; HaSS; Health; Religion.
- Please ensure your child's **pencil case is large enough** to fit in a set of pencils, set of textas, scissors and glue stick; small pencil cases do not fit all these items.
- Your child's current teacher will inform you later this term if there is a need for new **headphones** most children will simply carry on using their existing headphones.
- Each class will have a set of six to ten waterproof smocks that can be shared amongst the class.
- The P & F will be supporting the purchase of **library bags** on behalf of families that will reflect some school-related, child-created art; therefore, this will not be an expense.

# St Patrick's Catholic School COVID-19 School Safety Protocol

- Adults to please hand sanitise upon entering any school building: the school provides hand sanitiser at school venue entry points or adults may use their own (and be observed to use a sanitiser).
- o Adults, where practicable, to **maintain 1.5m physical distancing**, observing seating arrangements as communicated by signage or instruction please: indoor event attendance limited to one person per 2 square metre per indoor space.
- Adults to sign-in, either at the school office or on a list provided at the entry of the school building. The school is obligated to record contact details of visitors to school events held in school venues, with this information stored securely for a period of 21 days.
- o Appropriate COVID safe signage is communicated at school entry points. Key message to visitors if feeling unwell, it is important not to be in attendance; the school will bar entry to people who have tested positive for COVID-19 or who are close contacts of a person who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Although daily cleaning of frequently touched internal surfaces is undertaken, we ask adult visitors to avoid touching surfaces unnecessarily.
