PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Abraham Lincoln is attributed as saying "We can complain because rose bushes have thorns, or rejoice because a thorn bush has roses." Reading some of the adversities that Lincoln (and so many others who helped change the world for the better) faced in his life, and the achievement or 'success' that he helped create in his world, this simple quote is testimony to his belief that the secret of success is "Attitude" - and it is really not such a secret. People who succeed do not have fewer problems than others. They do not always start out with the most 'brainpower' or better parents or more money, either. A significant number of them start with nothing but a dream and a will to make that dream a reality.

Most people who succeed start out working against incredible odds, however, they have a way of looking at things, a way of seeing obstacles as possibilities, a way of 'hanging in there' and making the most of every opportunity that almost guarantees success. We parents can tell by the look of exasperation on our children's faces when we offer what we consider genuine encouragement to our children when they are facing an unexpected challenge. We might try to support them by placing the blame on others or on circumstances, however, we might be advised to ask instead "Are you not seeing the way around, because of an attitude?" "Are you getting in your own way, because of your attitudes?"

I read an article recently in which Roger Federer is said to focus his whole world on three words - humility, gratitude and humour. Life, if we are living it fully, never ceases to present us with challenges and problems to solve. The secret to successful living is not in finding an easy, carefree existence, but in being "up to" the trials that life brings. It has been said that we don't so much break down from overwork, but from "under being" - most of us are not given too much to cope with, it is just that sometimes we feel as if our inner resources are too low to handle it. A camping supply company slogan once put it this way: "See us for supplies so you can rough it smoothly." To rough it smoothly through life, you need to be well equipped, too. You need

good values, a good support system of people who care about you, a purpose you believe in strongly, an optimistic spirit, respect for others, and respect for yourself. May we all, at St Patrick's, be people whose attitude brings about positive change.


LIBRARY

- •Be available, reliable and willing to assist in promoting sport and other student welfare programs.

Student Representative Council per two terms per class (Years 3-6); voted by students in their respective classes

- •Consistently display WEST qualities (Welcoming, Encouraging, Saying sorry, Thanking)
- •Be reliable and willing to assist in promoting student welfare programs.

Prep 2020 (Mrs Jak)

Prep have settled in very well to their first week of school. This year is going to be an educational, social and physical year of growth for your child. It will be very rewarding to participate in and to observe your child develop their reading, writing, spelling, mathematical and general knowledge skills. To get off to a good start, I strongly encourage each child to read in the classroom of a morning with an adult and for the students to complete a fine motor activity. This is a great routine to get into, to start the day in a focused way ready to learn. Reading is encouraged every night. Information in regards to supporting your child with reading is enclosed in their Home Reader plastic pocket. Healthy lunches and water to drink are encouraged. A healthy lunch box full of fresh food gives your child the energy to concentrate, learn and play all day. Can you please pack a spare set of underwear in your child's school bag, sometimes accidents do happen! Please ensure ALL school clothing and shoes are labelled with your child's name. Our Teacher Assistant in Prep is Mrs D'Arne Adams. We look forward to working with you to nurture and educate your child.



What to expect in Year 4. (Mrs Meech)

Mrs Meech will be teaching Year 4 from Mondays to Fridays and the class will be supported by teacher assistant, Mrs Hyland. We warmly welcome our new students, Jack Chapman and Kyan Mayes. This year we look to cover the curriculum requirements of Year 4 with a focus on Biological Sciences, the colonisation of Australia in HASS and differing environments in Geography. In Mathematics we will be learning to recall the multiplication and division facts. In Religious Education we will be working on the units, "Jesus, God, Christian Life and Scripture," as well as continuing the "Spirit of Jesus" program. We will be participating in the Year 4 Camp at Camp Clayton on 11-12th May.
