PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

Welcome to term 2! Regardless of your location for the commencement of this new term of learning, I hope you still feel part of a supportive and an alert St Patrick's school community. A Turkish quote, "No road is long with good company" is quite apt in our current context and, I hope that all parents, students and staff remain comfortable in our collective desire to attend, in our individual and collective ways, to support not only student outcomes, but also our wellbeing.

Last Sunday was 'Good Shepherd Sunday, a time to reflect on the symbolism and metaphor of 'The Good Shepherd.' Psalm 23 opens with a metaphor that sets the tone of this important and cherished passage: it is the responsibility of the shepherd to find pastures that will provide enough grazing and abundant water for the entire flock, to lead them there without allowing any of the sheep to stray and be lost, to guard them from predators or dangers of any kind, and to attend to their every need. During this extraordinary time, this psalm reminds us to be more aware - 'Which voices do we follow?' 'Why do we follow these voices and not others?' Authentic leadership is required of parents and educators during this time of change that may not be our choice and, despite the individualism and sense of self-determination that tends to characterise our recent social history, genuine authority cherishes, guards and encourages the best in life; it provides rest and refreshment; it guides our steps; it nourishes us; it proclaims the truth, even if others find it hard to hear; it denounces error, even when this places him the authority figure in jeopardy; it calls for a change of heart, even when it makes great demands; it is committed to the enhancement of the lives of others.

There are times where we are the shepherds; there are times when we are the sheep. Every parent, every educator, every student has new demands placed on them as we embark upon Learning@Home and we must be willing to relinquish some of our own plans and self-determination and entrust ourselves to a renewed commitment to student outcomes, whilst acknowledging our own wellbeing. I pray that, when

we are entrusted with 'shepherd-like' responsibilities, that our vision looks to the horizons as well as scrutinising our flock, that we attend to the immediate needs in addition to preparing for the 'soon-to-be'. I pray that, when we are entrusted with 'sheep-like' responsibilities, that we are aware that, whilst there is security with the 'flock', there is a trusted relationship between shepherd and flock that is the result of shared experience.

Thank you for the tremendous support that staff have received from families and please be assured that staff will continue to support learning, which in the current context, implies considerable learning curves for us all.

Learning@Home Packs


Students who are attending school on an occasional/day-by-day basis must ensure that they bring with them their Learning@Home packs.

School Routines

Yesterday we welcomed 39 students to Learning@Home at school, and today we welcomed 54 students. In alignment with Catholic Education Tasmania's principles of supporting all families with learning, St Patrick's Catholic School is open to all students who want and need to attend our school. At the same time, Catholic Education Tasmania encourages students in the NW to remain at home in this next period wherever possible to connect with Learning@home at home, due to the government only recently easing serious restrictions in place across the NW. We will, though, support all students who are attending St Patrick's to access their learning.

To enable teachers to engage in our Learning@Home model more effectively, most students are located in the hall to complete their Learning@Home activities, which incorporates completing online and print-based tasks, participating in 'live' online sessions, and some self-directed activities. This model is learning in the sense that teachers have planned activities that reflect the Australian Curriculum, have learning intentions and feedback expectations - students who engage will acquire new skills, knowledge and understandings. In summary:

- Each class has a website that is located in the 'Learning@Home link, which is located via our school website. https://www.stpatslatrobe.tas.edu.au/
- For parents whose children are Learning@Home from home, please note your child's attendance via the 'Daily Attendance Record' link, which is located on the front page of every class website. This can also be used to indicate to the school if your child is absent due to sickness, however, parents may prefer to ring the school to indicate any absence due to illness.

Class Learning at Home websites contain class-specific learning and teaching support:

- O Weekly timetables.
- O Subject learning opportunities (reflecting the Australian Curriculum.)
- O A link to the Parent and student Question and Answer (Q & A) form.
- A link to the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) from parents and students.

Print-based Learning at Home packs will **complement** online learning and teaching plans – it supports the online learning resources. These packs will continue to be developed and compiled fortnightly by teachers and these packs will be available to families to be picked up at school during school hours (8.00am to 5.00pm) by a family member on the following days: Friday 15th May; Friday 29th May; Friday 12th June; Friday 26th June.

O Although many of these print-based tasks can be uploaded for teacher feedback via the class website options, families may return any completed work to the school when picking up Learning at Home print-based resources from school each fortnight.

Catholic Education Tasmania's Fee Assistance Policy forms the basis of a response to affected families. A condensed Fee assistance application form is available (via our school website or upon request from the school office) to parents and guardians, allowing you to provide an explanation of your current circumstances and the assistance you feel you need at this time. Mr Linhart and Mrs Leonard will assess each application subject to criteria. As noted on the Condensed Fee Assistance Form at footnote 2, each application is assessed on a term by term basis for 2020 fees only.
